Boundaries of the Waikari Pest Destruction District All that area in the Canterbury Land District, Waipara and Cheviot Counties, containing 615,200 acres, more or less, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the mean highwater mark of the sea in the middle of the Waipara River, in Block X, Teviotdale Survey District, and proceeding northwesterly generally up the middle of that river and the south branch of the Waipara River to its source, along a right line to Trig.
