Exemption is hereby granted to the Intellectually Handicapped Children's Society (Incorporated) Tauranga Branch, an organisation approved by the Minister of Labour under section 3 of the Disabled Persons Employment Promotion Act 1960, in respect of the sheltered workshop at 232 Levers Road, Tauranga, from:

- (a) All the provisions of every award and industrial agreement which would otherwise be applicable in respect of persons employed in that workshop; and
- (b) Section 34 of the Factories Act 1946 and all the provisions of the Annual Holidays Act 1944 and the Minimum Wage Act 1945.

3. The intellectually Handicapped Children's Society (Incorporated) Tauranga Branch Order 1965\* is hereby revoked.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the South Auckland Hydatids Control District Order 1972.

2. The areas comprising the Boroughs of Howick and Otahuhu and the Cities of Manukau and Papatoetoe as from time to time constituted are hereby declared a hydatids control district to be called the South Auckland Hydatids Control District.
