Sunday, 7 May 1972: Twice the number of game specified for Saturday, 6 May 1972.

Every subsequent day: As for Saturday, 6 May 1972.

- 3. It shall be an offence for any person to wilfully leave any swan(s) shot or the mutilated bodies of any swan(s) shot in the Auckland Acclimatisation District.
- 4. No person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Rotokauri any fixed stand, pontoon, hide, maimai, or loo, on any open water of the said lake.
