

Revoking Order in Council Prohibiting Alienation of Land Except to the Crown

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 24th day of April 1972

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 254 (2) of the Maori Affairs Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby revokes the Order in Council dated 1 August 1932 and published in *Gazette*, 4 August 1932, No. 52, page 1772, prohibiting all alienations of the Maori lands specified in the Schedule hereto other than alienation in favour of the Crown.
