Notice Amending the Quality Standards and Grades for Eggs (No. 292 Ag. 20210)

PURSUANT to regulation 59 of the Egg Marketing Authority Regulations 1953, the Egg Marketing Authority hereby gives notice that, as from 1 July 1972, the Notice Fixing and Determining the Quality Standards and Grades for Eggs (Ag. 10746), dated 12 January 1971\*, shall be amended as follows:

 (a) In each of the subparagraphs (2), (3), and (4) of clause
 4 (c) the expression "45° and 60°F" is revoked and the expression "7° and 16° Celsius" substituted therefor.

(b) In clause 5 (a), the following new subparagraph (4) is inserted after subparagraph (3):
"(4) Shall be applied only to eggs which, before

being graded, shall have been placed, as soon as practicable after having been laid, in cool rooms approved by the Authority on the farms where the eggs were laid, and held continuously thereafter in such cool rooms at a temperature of not less than 13° Celsius and not more than 16° Celsius until forwarded to the Authority's authorised agents to be graded, provided that no such eggs shall be held on the farm where they were produced for a period exceeding five days after the day on which they were
