5. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Board to remove or cause to be removed any stone, sand, shingle, or shells, without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

6. The Board shall not erect or grant a licence or permit or the erection or continuance of any structures on foreshore adjoining land under the control of a National Park Board or Scenic Board or Domain Board except with the consent of such Board.

7. The Board shall prevent any nuisance being caused and shall not permit fish or fish offal to remain on or about the foreshore.

8. The rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment or any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board 6 calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Board in New Zealand.
