Licensing Grant Alexander Magorian to Occupy a Site for a Jetty at the Taieri River

Amending Rules of Royal Society of New Zealand

PURSUANT to the Royal Society of New Zealand Act 1965, the fellows of the Royal Society of New Zealand, at the annual general meeting held on 12 May 1973, passed a resolution amending the rules of the Society published in the *Gazette* on 22 December 1965, 29 June 1967, and 13 June 1968, the effect of such resolution being

SECTION B—THE ELECTION OF COUNCIL AND OFFICERS

Rule B. 10 was amended to read:

Not later than March 31 the Council shall appoint two scrutineers from among the fellowship and shall cause to be posted to every fellow a voting paper listing alphabetically all valid nominations received for the officers and fellows' councillors for the coming year, and showing the scientific experience, vocation, and previous service on the Council of each nominee. The voting paper shall instruct the voter to delete the names of nominees for whom he does not wish to vote, leaving the name of not more than one candidate for each office and of up to eight candidates for fellows' councillors.
