A PROCLAMATION

Commission of Inquiry Into Certain Allegations

ORDER IN COUNCIL

To all to whom these presents shall come, and to:

RONALD KEITH DAVISON, of Auckland, one of Her Majesty's Counsel:

GREETING:

WHEREAS it is considered expedient that inquiry should be made into certain allegations of intimidation of union members and matters incidental thereto:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Commissions of Inquiry Act 1908, I, Sir Edward Denis Blundell, the Governor-General of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby appoint you, the said Ronald Keith Davison, to be a Commission to inquire into and report upon the following matters:

1. Allegations contained in a copy of an unsigned letter, and dated only "1974", addressed to "Mr J. J. Crummey, Secretary, 8-12 St. Martins Lane, Auckland 1" (a copy of which is set out in the Schedule hereto) and which was also attached to a letter signed by the Honourable J. B. Gordon, M.P., dated 14.8.74, addressed to the Honourable Hugh Watt and marked "CONFIDENTIAL AND PERSONAL", such restriction being orally lifted by the Honourable J. B. Gordon, M.P., some weeks later.

2. Any matters that the Commission considers are necessary to elucidate and explain the contents of the said first-mentioned letter.

3. Any matters that in the opinion of the Commission arise out of or are associated with the said first-mentioned letter and warrant such inquiry and report:
