

District; thence generally south-easterly along that boundary and the original high-water mark of the Otago Harbour to a point on the southern boundary of Section 23, Sawyers Bay Survey District, at Kilgour's Point, at the intersection of that high-water mark with a right line bearing 288 degrees from the nearest angle on the boundary of the area vested in the Otago Harbour Board by the Otago Harbour Board Lands Vesting Act 1910; thence south-easterly along that right line to the boundary of the area vested in the Otago Harbour Board, aforesaid; thence south-westerly along that boundary on a bearing of 238 degrees 20 minutes, distance 1259 metres and on a bearing of 207 degrees 30 minutes to a point in line with the south-western boundary of part Section 13, Upper Harbour West Survey District; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary and north-easterly along the north-western boundary of that Section 13 to the southernmost corner of Section 63, Block IX, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence north-westerly along that boundary and the south-western boundary of Section 2 of 5, Block IX, aforesaid, to the intersection of the last-mentioned boundary with a right line between Trig. E and the northernmost corner of Section 2 of 5, aforesaid; thence north-easterly along that line to that corner; thence north-westerly and north-easterly along the south-western and north-western boundaries of Section 2 of 4, Block IX, aforesaid, to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 82, North East Valley Survey District; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary and its production to the south-eastern boundary of Lot 2, Block II, D.P. 253; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundaries of Lots 2 and 1, Block II, D.P. 253, and north-westerly along the north-eastern boundaries of Lots 1, 4, 5, 6, and 7, Block II, D.P. 253, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the south-eastern boundary of Lot 8, Block II, D.P. 253; thence north-easterly along that boundary to the north-eastern boundary of original Section 43, Block VII, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence north-westerly along that boundary and its production to the south-western corner of Section 48, Block VIII, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District; thence north-westerly, south-westerly, and again north-westerly along the south-western, south-eastern, and again south-western boundaries of Section 48, aforesaid, to its westernmost corner; thence south-westerly and north-westerly along the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Section 62, Block VIII, aforesaid, to the northernmost corner of Section 61, Block VIII, aforesaid; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundary of Lot 3, D.P. 12466, to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 61, aforesaid; thence south-easterly in line with the south-western boundary of Section 61, aforesaid, to the middle of the road forming the south-eastern boundary of Block VIII, aforesaid; thence south-westerly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of part Section 1, Block VIII, aforesaid; thence north-westerly to the easternmost corner of that part Section 1; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundaries of that part Section 1 and part Section 3, and Section 4, Block VIII, aforesaid, to the southernmost corner of that Section 4; thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of Section 4, aforesaid, to a point due east of the northernmost corner of Section 83, Block V, Dunedin and East Taieri Survey District; thence due west to that corner and south-westerly along the north-western boundaries of that Section 83, Section 82, Block V, aforesaid, and Lot 2, D.P. 5108, to the westernmost corner of that Lot 2; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundary of that Lot 2 and its production to the right bank of the Water of Leith; thence generally southerly along that bank to a point due east of the southernmost corner of Section 73, Block V, aforesaid; thence due west to that corner and north-westerly along the south-western boundary of that Section 73 to the south-eastern side of Finnerty Road; thence generally south-westerly and north-westerly along the south-eastern and south-western sides of Finnerty Road to the south-eastern boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 7092; thence south-westerly along that boundary and north-westerly along the south-western boundaries of Lots 1 and 2, D.P. 7092, to the southernmost corner of Section 54, Block V, aforesaid; thence northerly along the eastern boundaries of Sections 54 and 55, Block V, aforesaid, to the south-western side of an unnamed road; thence generally south-easterly along the south-western side of that road to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section 9, Block V, aforesaid; thence north-easterly to and along that boundary and the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 10 and 11, Block V, aforesaid, to the easternmost corner of that Section 11; thence northerly to and along the eastern boundary of Section 3, Block V, aforesaid, to Swampy Spur Trig. Station, the point of commencement.

KARITANE RIDING

ALL that area in the Otago Land District, Waikouaiti County, bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the right bank of the Waikouaiti River and the mean high-water mark of the sea and proceeding generally easterly and south-westerly along the mean high-water mark of the sea to the north-eastern boundary of Section 5, Block XII, Waikouaiti Survey District; thence north-westerly along that boundary and its production to the north-western side of Coast Road; thence north-easterly along that road to the south-western boundary of Section 16; thence north-westerly and north-easterly along the south-western and north-western boundaries of that Section 16 and Section 15, to the northernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence generally north-westerly along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 71, 72A1, 73, and 110, to the generally south-eastern side of the Lyttelton-Invercargill-Bluff Railway; thence generally north-easterly along the last-mentioned boundary to its intersection with the right bank of the Waikouaiti River; thence generally south-easterly along that bank to the point of commencement.

WAITATI RIDING

ALL that area in the Otago Land District, Waikouaiti County, bounded by a line commencing at the south-western corner of Block I, North Harbour and Blueskin Survey District, and proceeding northerly along the western boundary of the said Block I to its intersection with the centre line of Miller Road; thence north-westerly and generally north-easterly along that centre line and the centre line of Manse Road and its production to the mean high-water mark of the sea; thence generally southerly, north-easterly, easterly, and southerly again along the mean high-water mark of the sea to a point in line with the northern boundary of the Purakaunui Maori Block in Block IV; thence generally southerly, and westerly to and along the generally western and northern boundaries of the said Purakaunui Maori Block, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the eastern boundary of Block I; thence generally southerly along that boundary to the north-western boundary of Section 66; thence generally south-westerly and southerly along that boundary and the western boundary of Section 66, aforesaid, to the southern boundary of Block I; thence westerly along that boundary to the point of commencement.

Electrical Wiring Regulations 1961—Composite T.R.S. and T.P.S. Cables With Uninsulated Earth-continuity Conductors

PURSUANT to the provisions of regulation 7 of the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1961, permission is hereby granted for the use in electrical installations coming within the scope of the regulations of imported T.R.S. and T.P.S. cable with uninsulated earth-continuity conductors. It is a condition of the use of such cable that all earth-continuity conductors exposed by the removal of the sheath shall be insulated with a flexible sleeve in accordance with regulation 152 (10) of the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1961.
