WHEREAS by Our Warrant dated the 25th day of February 1974* We nominated, constituted, and appointed you, the said the Honourable Sir Trevor Ernest Henry, to be a said the HONOURABLE SIR TREVOR ERNEST HENRY, to be a Commission to inquire and report generally on the action (if any) which should be taken, whether by or pursuant to legislation or otherwise, to enable the land known as Rangatira B and Rangatira C to be used effectively or otherwise dealt with by the owners thereof or for their benefit in such a way as will be to their best advantage and in the public interest:

And whereas by Our said Warrant you were required to report to His Excellency the Governor-General, not later than the 31st day of August 1974, your findings and opinions on the matters aforesaid, together with such recommendations as you might think fit to make in respect thereof:

Now, therefore, We do hereby extend until the 30th day of November 1974, the time within which you are so required to report, without prejudice to the liberty conferred on you by Our said Warrant to report your proceedings and findings from time to time if you should judge it expedient so to do:

And We do hereby confirm Our said Warrant and the Commission thereby constituted save as modified by these presents:

And, lastly, it is hereby declared that these presents are issued under the authority of the Letters Patent of His Late Majesty King George the Fifth, dated the 11th day of May 1917, and under the authority of and subject to the provisions of the Commissions of Inquiry Act 1908, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zeeland. of New Zealand.
