Licensing Charles Frederick Warren to Occupy a Site for a Mussel Platform in Kaipara Harbour

PURSUANT to section 162 of the Harbours Act 1950, the Executive Officer, Harbours, Foreshores, and Pollution Section, Marine Department, acting under a delegation from the Minister of Marine and Fisheries, pursuant to section 265A of the aforesaid Act, hereby licenses and permits Charles Frederick Warren, of Tinopai, Matakohe R.D. (hereinafter called the licensee, which term shall include his administrators, executors or successors or assigns unless the context requires a different construction) to use and occupy a part of the foreshore between Te Kauri and The Bluff in Kaipara Harbour as shown on plan marked M.D. 14379 and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for the purpose of maintaining thereon a mussel platform as shown on the said plan, such licence to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

(1) This licence is subject to the Foreshore Licence Regulations 1960, and the provisions of those regulations shall, so far as applicable, apply hereto.

(2) The term of the licence shall be 5 years from the 1st day of May 1972.

(3) The premium payable by the licensee shall be ten dollars (\$10) and the annual sum so payable by the licensee shall be twenty dollars (\$20).
