Bylaw Fixing the Maximum Speed of Vehicles on No. 6 State Highway (Blenheim-Invercargill via Nelson and Grey-mouth) at Frankton

PURSUANT to the National Roads Act 1953 and the Transport Act 1962, the National Roads Board makes the following bylaw.

BYLAW

1. This bylaw may be cited as the National Roads Board Bylaw 1975, No. 5.

2. This bylaw shall come into force on the day after the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

3. In this bylaw "vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it in the Transport Act 1962.
