Licensing Sunshine Bay Development Limited to Occupy a Site for a Jetty and Boat Launching Ramp in Sunshine Bay, Lake Wakatipu

PURSUANT to section 162 of the Harbours Act 1950, I, Grant Stewart Ellis Milne of the Ministry of Transport, in exercise of powers delegated by the Minister of Transport, hereby license and permit Sunshine Bay Development Ltd. (hereinafter called the licensee, which term shall include its successors or assigns unless the context requires a different construction) to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and bed of Sunshine Bay, Lake Wakatipu, as shown on plans marked M.D. 13215 and M.D. 15528 and deposited in the office of the Ministry of Transport at Wellington, for the purpose of maintaining thereon a jetty and boat launching ramp as shown on the said plans, such licence to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto. The licence of 16 December 1968* and amended on 7 February 1972† is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE
CONDITIONS

(1) This licence is subject to the Foreshore Licence Regulations 1960 and the provisions of those regulations shall, so far as applicable, apply hereto.

(2) The term of the licence shall be 7 years from the 1st day of December 1974.

(3) The annual sum so payable by the Licensee shall be forty dollars (\$40); provided always that the Minister may review the annual sum payable at the end of the first year or any subsequent year of the said term.
