#### Revoking Declaration of State Highway and Declaring Public Highway to be State Highway

#### Notice of Approval by the Price Tribunal of Increase in Charge-out Rates for Specified Services

UPON reading the report of the Secretary, Department of Trade and Industry, dated 24 July 1975, proposing that the Tribunal exercise its discretionary power under regulation 2 of the Price Freeze Regulations (No. 6) 1973 to approve to the trades nominated in the Schedule thereto recovery by way of increased charge-out rates of the additional direct labour costs arising out of the Wages Adjustment Regulations 1974, Amendment No. 4, the Tribunal resolves:

"To approve, that trades subject to the Price Freeze Regulations (No. 6) 1973 be permitted to recover by way of charge-out rates the increased labour costs attributable to direct labour arising from the Wage Adjustment Regulation 1974, Amendment No. 4, less the amount of recovery of which was authorised under Tribunal Decision No. 5501 dated 20 February 1975."\*
