The photographs are contrived and the captions are designed to titillate and excite. The material is tastelessly and insensitively presented and no allowance is made for "elements in the relationship apart from the combation". in the relationship apart from the acrobatics".

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent.

Their number is excessive and very few are in accord with the informative nature of the text. Several are irrelevant. Thus the photographs would appear to have no other purpose than to boost sales.

The Tribunal regards the text as camouflage designed to render the photographs acceptable and considers this book to be lacking in honesty of purpose.

The Tribunal classifies this book as indecent.
