

respect of each of the parks, be revoked and in substitution therefor a new by-law be made as set out in the First Schedule hereto, and further, pursuant to the said Act, the Mount Aspiring National Park Board has passed a resolution resolving that By-law No. 9 of the by-laws, made in respect of the park, be revoked and in substitution therefor a new by-law be made, as set out in the Second Schedule hereto; and such resolutions have been approved by the National Parks Authority.

It is therefore declared that the said by-laws have been amended accordingly.

FIRST SCHEDULE

9. AIRCRAFT

Except in accordance with written permission previously obtained from the Board

- (a) No person, whether a pilot or passenger, shall land within or depart from the park on any aircraft (including aeroplanes, helicopters, gliders, hang-gliders, balloons);
- (b) No person shall land in the park by parachute;
- (c) No person within the park shall use or operate or attempt to use or operate a hang-glider.

This by-law shall not apply at public licensed aerodromes or Government civil aerodromes in the park or in cases of emergency.

Further, no person, operator, or pilot in command of an aircraft of any description, shall make use of any part of the park, whether land or water, for the purpose of setting down, picking up, or recovery from within the park of any person, livestock, carcass, or article of any description, except in accordance with the written permission of the Board previously obtained.

SECOND SCHEDULE

9. AIRCRAFT

Except in accordance with written permission previously obtained from the Board—

- (a) No person, whether a pilot or passenger, shall land within or depart from the park on any aircraft (including aeroplanes, helicopters, gliders, hang-gliders, balloons);
- (b) No person shall land in the park by parachute;
- (c) No person within the park shall use or operate or attempt to use or operate a hang-glider.

This by-law shall not apply in cases of emergency.

Further, no person, operator, or pilot in command of an aircraft of any description, shall make use of any part of the park, whether land or water, for the purpose of setting down, picking up, or recovery from within the park of any person, livestock, carcass, or article of any description, except in accordance with the written permission of the Board previously obtained.
