PURSUANT to the Exhibitions Act 1910, the Minister of Trade and Industry hereby gives notice as follows:

- In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires-
 - "The Act" means the Exhibitions Act 1910;
 - "The promoter" means the Wellington Show Association Inc.;

 "The exhibition" means a public exhibition of works of industry and art to be conducted by the promoter at the Wellington Show Buildings from the 6th day of May 1976 to the 22nd day of May 1976 (both days inclusive), and to be known as the New Zealand Trade Fair 1976 (Wellington).
