*Notice of Intention to Vary Hours of Sale of Liquor at Chartered Club Premises—King Country Licensing Committee*

PURSUANT to section 221A (16) of the Sale of Liquor Act 1962, as amended by the Sale of Liquor Amendment Act 1976, I, Gordon Stewart Orr, Secretary for Justice, hereby give notice that the King Country Licensing Committee on 27 June 1977 made an order authorising variations of the usual hours for the sale of liquor to the public, and further authorised the following hours of trading for the chartered club premises known as Taumarunui Cosmopolitan Club (Incorporated), Taumarunui:

- (a) On every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday (not being Christmas Eve or New Year's Eve (nor days when chartered clubs are required to be closed for the sale of liquor to their members) the hour of opening shall be 11 o'clock in the morning and the hour of closing 10 o'clock in the evening.
