His Excellency the Governor-General has announced the award of The Queen's Commendation for Brave Conduct to:

Sapper Laurence Gerald SALMON (D759946), 1st Field Squadron, Royal New Zealand Engineers.

During the period 3 to 7 October 1977 Sapper Salmon's unit was engaged on a bridge demolition task at the Waiotukupuna was engaged on a oringe demonsion task at the warotukupuna Stream. His particular task involved the gas cutting of the blast exposed reinforcing steel rods. As Sapper Salmon was completing this task the bridge quite unexpectedly started to collapse. This caused a sudden escape of gas from the high pressure oxy-acetylene equipment. Recognising the immediate risk of an explosion, and the danger to others, and with complete disregard for his own safety, Sapper Salmon ran across the moving structure and freed the bottles from the collapsing bridge. He then fell with the bridge into the stream approximately 20 feet below. Sapper Salmon's prompt and courageous action greatly reduced the danger to 15 other soldiers working nearby.
