

Boundaries of Otahuhu Borough Defined

PURSUANT to section 48 of the Local Government Act 1974, the Secretary for Local Government hereby defines as set out in the Schedule hereto, the boundaries of Otahuhu Borough, following the inclusion in the borough of an area of reclaimed land by notice signed by the Minister of Local Government, on 25 May, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, 1 June 1978, No. 48, p. 1576.

SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District containing 560 hectares, more or less, bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the middle line of the North Island Main Trunk Railway with the northern side of Portage Road in Block VI, Otahuhu Survey District, and proceeding easterly along the northern side of Portage Road to the left bank of Otahuhu Creek; thence southerly, generally, along that bank to and easterly generally, along the right bank of Otahuhu Creek to and southerly, generally along the left bank of Tamaki River to and along the generally eastern boundaries of Section 63, Block VI, Otahuhu Survey District, to and south westerly generally, along the said left bank to and along the generally eastern boundaries of Allotment 97, Small Farms Near Otahuhu, to and again along the said left bank to its intersection with the middle line of the North Island Main Trunk Railway; thence northerly, generally, along the middle line of the aforesaid railway to the point of commencement.
