To the intent that on days other than those on which licensed premises are required to be closed for the sale of liquor to the public the hours for the opening and closing of the said premises shall be as follows:

- (a) On any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday (not being Christmas Eve or New Year's Eve)—
 Opening at 9 o'clock in the morning and closing at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, reopening at 3 o'clock in the afternoon and closing at 10 o'clock in the evening evening.
- (b) On any Friday, Saturday (not being New Year's Eve) and Christmas Eve—Opening at 9 o'clock in the morning and closing at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, re-opening at 3 o'clock in the afternoon and closing at 11 o'clock in the evening.
- (c) On New Year's Eve—Opening at 9 o'clock in the morning and closing at 1 o'clock in the afternoon, reopening at 3 o'clock in the afternoon and closing at 00.30 o'clock on New Year's Day.
