*Notice of Intention to Vary Hours of Sale of Liquor at Licensed Premises—Hurunui Licensing Committee*

PURSUANT to section 221A of the Sale of Liquor Act 1962, as amended by section 22 (14) of the Sale of Liquor Amendment Act 1976, I, John Fraser Robertson, Secretary for Justice, hereby give notice that the Hurunui Licensing Committee, on 6 June 1979, made on order authorising variations of the usual hours of trading for the licensed premises known as the Railway Hotel, Amberley.

To the intent that on days other than those on which licensed premises are required to be closed for the sale of liquor to the general public the hours for the opening and closing of the said premises shall be as follows:

*Notice of Intention to Vary Hours of Sale of Liquor at Licensed Premises—Hurunui Licensing Committee*

PURSUANT to section 221A of the Sale of Liquor Act 1962, as amended by section 22 (14) of the Sale of Liquor Amendment Act 1976, I, John Fraser Robertson, Secretary for Justice, hereby give notice that the Hurunui Licensing Committee, on 6 June 1979, made on order authorising variations of the usual hours of trading for the licensed premises known as the Junction Hotel, Rangiora.
