DZ 4504 Fire hose reels (Revision of NZS 1168:1954 and NZS 2049:1966).

The Standards Act 1965—Draft New Zealand Standard Specification Available for Comment

PURSUANT to subsection (3) of section 23 of the Standards Act 1965, notice is hereby given that the following draft New Zealand Standard specification is being circulated.

Number and Title of Specification

DZ 6206 Code of practice for the installation of domestic meter boxes.

This draft code is complementary to the Code for domestic electrical installations, published by the Electric Supply Authority Engineers' Institute. It will establish a standard method of wiring and the use of meter enclosures of a standard physical size.

The draft also defines minimum supply arrangements for domestic installations to ensure that there is adequate margin for future load increases without committing the consumer to major (and costly) upgrading of his installation.
