*Notice of Intention to Vary Hours of Sale of Liquor at
Licensed Premises—Dunedin Licensing Committee*

PURSUANT to section 221A of the Sale of Liquor Act 1962, as amended by section 22 (14) of the Sale of Liquor Amendment Act 1976, I, John Fraser Robertson, Secretary for Justice, hereby give notice that the Dunedin Licensing Committee on 20 October 1981, made an order authorising variations of the usual hours of trading for the licensed premises known as the Royal Albert Tavern, Dunedin.
