In December 1979, the New Zealand Manufacturers' Federation published a list of Schedule A goods subject to import licensing control, seeking comments on the possibility of making these goods Licence on Demand (L.O.D.) when of Australian origin.

Following consideration of representations received, L.O.D. status will apply to the Schedule A products listed below from 20 March 1981. Licences on demand will be issued against firm orders for these goods when of Australian origin, subject to the proviso that the pattern of imports will be monitored and the access position could be subject to adjustment if the level of imports resulted in serious harm to New Zealand manufacturers.
