Education is seen as a lifelong activity, and emphasis is therefore placed on the "foundations"—early childhood edu-cation, the school curriculum and special provisions for special needs, and parent education.

Special attention is given also to the relationship between the school and the community, the need for close mutual support and co-operation, including understanding and respect for minority cultures.

A key to the quality of education is the people involved in it. Teacher education, the availability of advisory and ancillary staff, as well as resources for materials and research, have

stan, as well as resources for materials and research, have a chapter devoted to them. Since education is seen as a lifelong activity, this is con-sidered at some length. Facets such as accessibility, transfer of credits, and the role of existing institutions are discussed, together with ways in which continuing education could be provided for the whole community.

In discussing the administration and organisation of edu-cation the principle followed is the maximum devolution of authority and responsibility to the agencies and the com-munity, as for instance, school committee and district level.
