

boundary of Rangitoto Tuhua 77B1B2C2A Block, Block III, Tangitu Survey District; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary and its production to the middle of the North Island Main Trunk Railway; thence northerly along the middle of that railway to a point in line with the original northern boundary of part Rangitoto Tuhua 78B2K Block; thence easterly generally to and along that boundary, the generally northern boundaries of parts Rangitoto Tuhua 78B2E, 78B2D, 78B2H Blocks, part Whenuatupu No. 3, Whenuatupu No. 2 and 1 Blocks, and Rangitoto Tuhua 78B2A1 Block, to and along the western boundary of Section 1, Block III, Pahi Survey District, the western and northern boundaries of Sub. 1 of Section 2, Block III, aforesaid, to and northerly along the western boundary of Rangitoto Tuhua 37B1 and part Rangitoto Tuhua 37B5 Blocks, to and along the northern boundaries of the said part Rangitoto Tuhua 37B5 and Rangitoto Tuhua 37B No. 4 and 3 Blocks, to the easternmost corner of Section 1, Block II, Ongarue Survey District, thence southerly along the western boundary of the former Rangitoto Tuhua 36A1B2A2 Block as shown on M.L. 14216, thence easterly along the northern boundaries of the former Rangitoto Tuhua 36A1B2B1, 36A1B2B2A and 36A1B2B2B Blocks as shown on M.L. 14900, thence southerly along the eastern boundary of the former Rangitoto Tuhua 36A1B2B2B Block as shown on M.L. 14900 to Trig. 1394, Pukemako, thence generally south-easterly along a right line to Trig. 1551, Kete-maringa, thence generally southerly along a right line to the north-eastern corner of Rangitoto Tuhua part 10 Block, thence generally southerly along the generally eastern boundaries of Rangitoto Tuhua part 10, 51, 21A, 21B1C, 21B1A, 67D and part 67B1 Blocks, to the western end of Hauhungaroa part 8D Block, thence generally easterly along the northern boundaries of Hauhungaroa part 8D, part 8 (roadway), another part 8D, part 8C, part 8B1, part 8A, another part 8C, 9, 2D2, 4, 5, part 2C Blocks, to and generally down the middle of the Orua-puraho Stream crossing S.H. 32 to the western shore of Lake Taupo, thence by right line across that lake to the intersection of the northern boundary of Tauhara South part B Block with the eastern shore, thence along that northern boundary to the western side of S.H. 1, thence along a right line to and along the northern boundaries of another Tauhara South part B Block, Tauhara South part A Block, Lot 4, D.P. S. 9889 to the easternmost corner, thence generally north-easterly to and along the north-western boundaries of part Wharetoto No. 8 and part Wharetoto No. 9 Blocks to the left bank of the Rangitaiki River, thence generally southerly along the left banks of the Rangitaiki River and Tirikahu Stream, to and along the western boundaries of part Lot 2A, D.P. 17646, to the north-east corner of Wharetoto 4 Block, thence to and along the eastern boundaries of Wharetoto 4 Block to the Hawke's Bay Land District boundary; thence south-westerly generally along the north-western boundary of the Hawke's Bay Land District as described in *Gazette*, 1936, page 1808, to the middle of the Manawatu River; thence westerly down the middle of that river to a point in line with the production of the western boundary of Section 1, Block I, Mangahao Survey District; thence south-westerly generally to and along that boundary and its production to the eastern side of North Range Road, to and along that side of North Range Road, the generally south-western boundaries of Lot 3 of Section 26, Block II, Mangahao Survey District, the road forming the north-western boundaries of Sections 2 and 10, Block II, Mangahao Survey District, the eastern side of North Range Road to the northern side of Pahiatua-Aokautere Road, a right line to and along the eastern side of South Range Road, the south-western boundaries of Sections 19 and 13, Block XIX, Mangahao Survey District, the north-western boundaries of Sections 1, 2, and 3, Block VI, Mangahao Survey District, and Section 4, Block V, Mangahao Survey District, and its production to the north-western corner of Section 9, Block IX, Mangahao Survey District, to and along right lines to Trig.
