1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 218, and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 199\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

2. This order shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1981.

3. The principal order is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule thereto, and substituting the following Schedule.

**SCHEDULE****STANDARD RATES OF MARGINS AND ALLOWANCES PAYABLE IN RESPECT OF THE DELIVERY OF TOWN MILK**

Nature of Service	Margin or Allowance at the Rate of Cents per Litre
1. Delivery in respect of shop-dairy sale in any quantity .....	6.17
2. Delivery in respect of commercial-user sale or consumer sale in quantities of—	
(1) Less than 12 litres per delivery .....	12.34
(2) 12 litres and over per delivery .....	6.17

3. In addition, there shall be payable to every vendor entitled to claim margins or allowances in terms of the Milk Marketing Order 1968, the sum of \$17.30 per day for every day on which deliveries are undertaken.

To the intent that on days other than those on which licensed premises are required to be closed for the sale of liquor to the general public the hours for the opening and closing of the said premises shall be as follows:

During the period 1 November to 31 March and pertaining to the lounge bar only:
