

7. If an objection is made, a public hearing of the objection will be held unless written notice is given to the Tribunal that the objector wants the hearing to be held in private.

8. If an objection is made:

- (a) The objector will be advised the time and place of the hearing; and
- (b) Will have the right to appear and to be heard personally or to be represented by a barrister and solicitor or any other person you authorise.

YOUR RIGHT TO COMPENSATION

9. This notice and the right to object described above, relate to the taking of the land and not rights to compensation.

Under the Public Works Act 1981 you are entitled to full compensation if your interest in the land is taken. If this compensation cannot be agreed between you and the Franklin County Council, it can be determined in separate proceedings before the Land Valuation Tribunal.

WARNING

This notice concerns your rights over the land referred to. If you are in any doubt about its effect, you should obtain Legal Advice immediately. Do not delay.
