

3. The generation of electricity by the use of water pursuant to this consent shall be carried out by means of the works described in the Schedule hereto.

4. This consent shall, unless it is sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 31st day of March 2003.

5. This consent confers no rights to water under the Water and Soil Conservation Act 1967 or otherwise.

6. For the purpose of assessing the rental or annual sum payable in respect of this consent, the maximum generating capacity of the plant at the date of this consent is 10 kW.

General Description of Works

- (a) Headworks consisting of a weir and intake with a water race and pipeline leading to the powerhouse giving a static head of approximately 48.8 metres.
- (b) Powerhouse with all necessary equipment for generating electricity situated in part Section 1 of 11, Block III, Totoranui Survey District.

Electric Lines Licence—Authorising James Martin Robertson to Erect and Use Electric Lines

CONDITIONS

2. The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (d) of regulation 15 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1976, and shall be a direct current system.

3. This licence shall, unless it is sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 31st day of March 2003.

ELECTRIC lines leading from the powerhouse in a northerly direction and crossing the Tarakohe-Totoranui Road to a woolshed and worker's dwelling.
