2. That so long as any part of the existing share premium account amounting to \$30,000 is undistributed, the accounts of the company shall be noted so as to show:

- (a) The existence of the resolution of 13 August 1981; and
- (b) What part of the account remains undistributed but still subject to the resolution.

3. That a sealed copy of this order be registered with the Registrar of Companies.

4. That notice of registration of this order with the Registrar of Companies to be published once in *New Zealand Gazette*.

NEW ZEALAND WOOL BOARD

PURSUANT to regulation 15 of the Wool Industry Regulations 1978, notice is hereby given that the Adjusted Weighted Average Sale Price for the sale held on 11 June 1982 at Wellington was 258.21 cents per kilogram (greasy basis).
