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Import Licence Tendering—Results for Tenders of Round 9

THE following are the official results originally obtained for Round 9 of the Import Licence Tendering Scheme. This round comprises the tender of a new combined category for women's shirts and blouses to replace tender numbers 1073, 1074, 1091, and 1092 withdrawn from Round Seven.

Round Nine also includes the first allocation of tenders for tyres under the Tyre and Tube Industry Development Plan. Licences obtained in Round 9 are valid for 12 months from 10 September 1983.

This Supplement repeats the Call for Tenders issued for Round 9 to allow ease of cross reference with the results.

In submitting these tenders each tenderer has signed a declaration that the enterprise concerned is domiciled in New Zealand; has been actively trading throughout the immediately preceding 12 months; does not act in this matter on behalf of any other person; and has not submitted tenders in excess of the maximum number of tenders specified in the Call for Tenders.

- 1. Tenderers should refer to the Customs Tariff and the Import Licensing Schedule for a definite description of the goods included in the list above.
- 2. Tenderers should be conversant with the various statutes and regulations which importing enterprises are obliged to comply with, such as the Food and Drug Regulations 1973, Safety Standards, Duties and Sales Tax, etc., where relevant.
- 3. Successful tenderers under the Apparel Tendering Scheme are required to provide details of how their tender licence(s) have been used at the time of importation. Forms for this purpose will be attached to the letter of official notification sent to successful tenderers. The completed information should be sent to the Executive Officer, Textiles 1, Industries Division, Department of Trade and Industry, Private Bag, Wellington.

Failure to provide this information is likely to result in the tenderer being debarred from further participation in the scheme.

4. Tenderers are reminded to use a separate tender form for each tender number. Bids may be sent in one envelope. The envelope should be marked Import Licence Tender.
