to all existing encumbrances, all land previously vested in the corporation of the territorial authority from which the area is excluded.

- 6. Chairman and principal administrative officer—The chairman and principal administrative officer of the Clifton County Council shall exercise the duties, powers, and functions of the chairman apprincipal administrative officer of the Stratford County Council in respect of the area described in the First Schedule to this order, and the chairman and principal administrative officer of the Stratford County Council shall exercise the duties, powers, and functions of the chairman and principal administrative officer of the Clifton County Council in respect of the area described in the Second Schedule to this order.
- 7. Creditors—Subject to section 37F of the Local Government Act 1974, the rights or interests of creditors of any district affected by this order shall not be affected.
- 8. Rating—The system of rating in the areas described in the First and Second Schedule to this order shall continue to be the land value system.
