Import Restriction on Cut Flowers (Notice No. 3340; AG. 12/2/12)

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Plants Act 1970, the Director-General hereby restricts the introduction into New Zealand of the following cut flowers from the specified regions or countries unless the Director-General is satisfied the importation will not introduce into the country the specified pests and diseases not known to be present in New Zealand.

Cut Flowers	Major Region, Country or Place from which Introduction is Restricted	Major Reasons for Restriction
Carnation Chrysanthemum Gypsophila	North and South American, Europe and Africa	Leaf miners, <i>Lirium zo trifolii</i> , <i>L. sauivac</i> , <i>L. huidobrensis</i> .
Gladiolus	All countries where rust diseases occur, including Mediterranean countries and Africa	Rust diseases, <i>Uromyces gladioli</i> , <i>U. uransv r salis</i> .
Roses	Japan	Rust disease, <i>Keuhnola japonica</i> .

All imports of the above cut flowers shall be subject to prior approval by permit to import issued by the officer-in-charge of the Plant Health and Diagnostic Station at Levin.
