ORDER

1. **Title**—This order may be cited as the New Zealand Society for the Intellectually Handicapped (Incorporated), Taranaki Branch Order 1984.

2. **Exemption**—The New Zealand Society for the Intellectually Handicapped (Incorporated), Taranaki Branch an organisation approved\* by the Minister of Labour under section 3 of the Disabled Persons Employment Promotion Act 1960, is hereby granted exemption in respect of its sheltered workshop at Broadway North, Stratford from:
