Decoy limit: No limit.

**Special Conditions**

1. No person shall, for the purpose of hunting or killing game, use any fixed stand, pontoon, hide, maimai, or loo on the waters of Upper Lagoon to Morgans Creek and Chandlers Lagoon, situated approximately 10 kilometres south east of Blenheim.

2. It shall be an offence for any person to wilfully leave on the hunting ground the bodies or parts of bodies of black swan or other game shot in the Marlborough Acclimatisation District.

**Special Conditions**

1. No hut, mudhole, stand, hide, shelter, maimai, boat, louvre, or cylinder or other contrivance shall be used for the hunting or killing of game in any part of Lake Ellesmere in which the water is of a greater depth than 60 cm, excepting such areas as may be decided upon by the North Canterbury Acclimatisation Society, provided that nothing in this special condition shall prevent any person using any vessel for the purpose of retrieving game that has been killed or wounded.

2. It shall be an offence for any person to wilfully leave on the hunting ground the bodies or parts of bodies of black swan or other game shot in the North Canterbury Acclimatisation District.

**Definition of Areas**

Area A: The Maniototo County.

Area B: All that part of the Taieri catchment upstream from Hindon outside Area 'A'; all that part of the Shag catchment above Dunback; that part of the Manuherikia catchment outside Area 'A'; and that part of the Clutha River catchment to the east of the Clutha River from Cromwell Gorge to Beaumont.

Area C: The Waikaia catchment; the Pomahaka catchment upstream from Conical Hills; and the Waipori catchment upstream from Waipori Falls township; and that part of the Clutha River catchment to the west of the Clutha River from Cromwell Gorge to Beaumont.
