Specifications Declared Suitable

Australian Standard

AS 2236-1985 Electrical Equipment for Explosive Atmospheres—Dust—Excluding Ignition Proof (DIP) Enclosure.

British Standard

BS 6467: Part 1 : 1985 Electrical apparatus with protection by enclosure for use in the presence of combustible dusts.

Compliance with a declared standard shall not preclude the need to comply with the requirements of the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1976.

Hospitals Act 1957

Extending the Time Within Which Committee of Inquiry into Procedures Used in Certain Psychiatric Hospitals in Relation to Admission, Discharge, or Release on Leave of Certain Classes of Patients May Report

To all to whom these presents shall come, and to:

KENNETH HECTOR MASON, of Auckland, District Court Judge.

ALLISON BERNICE RYAN, of Wellington, Medical Practitioner, and

HENRY RONGOMAU BENNETT, C.B.E., Q.S.O., of Rotorua, Medical Practitioner:

Whereas, by Warrant dated the 2nd day of July 1987*, you were appointed to be a Committee of Inquiry to inquire into the matters set out in that Warrant, being matters concerning the procedures used in certain psychiatric hospitals in relation to the admission, discharge, or release on leave of certain classes of patients:

And whereas the terms of reference set out in the said Warrant were amended, by Warrant dated the 9th day of November 1987†, so that inquiry could be made into the use of those procedures at the psychiatric hospitals administered by the West Coast Hospital Board:

And whereas, by the said Warrant dated the 2nd day of July 1987, you are required to submit your report not later than the 31st day of December 1987:

And whereas it is expedient that the time for so reporting should be extended as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, pursuant to section 13 (3) of the Hospitals Act 1957, I, DAVID FRANCIS CAYGILL, Minister of Health, hereby extend until the 30th day of April 1988 the time within which you are so required to report, without prejudice to the liberty conferred on you by the said Warrant dated the 2nd day of July 1987 to report your proceedings from time to time if you should judge it expedient to do so.

And I hereby confirm the said Warrant dated the 2nd day of July 1987, save as amended by the said Warrant dated the 9th day of November 1987 and by this Warrant.

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Medicines Act 1981

Classification of Medicines Notice

Pursuant to section 106 (1) of the Medicines Act 1981, the Minister of Health hereby declares the medicines specified in the first column of the Schedule to this notice to be medicines in accordance with the classification specified in the second column of the Schedule in relation to that medicine.

Schedule

<i>Medicine</i>	<i>Classification</i>
HYOSCINE; and its salts; in medicines for transdermal delivery	Prescription medicine
SCOPOLAMINE; and its salts; in medicines for transdermal delivery	Prescription medicine
HYOSCINE; and its salts; in medicines containing less than 0.15 percent of hyoscine, except in medicines for transdermal delivery	Pharmacy-only medicine
SCOPOLAMINE; and its salts; in medicines containing less than 0.15 percent of scopolamine, except in medicines for transdermal delivery	Pharmacy-only medicine
