Timber Preservation Regulations 1984—Branding and Identification of Preservative Treated Timber

PURSUANT to regulation 12 of the Timber Preservation Regulations 1984, the Timber Preservation Authority hereby gives notice that clause 1.4 of the said regulations is revoked.

1.4 "Surface Brand means a brand placed on the face, back or edge of treated timber by incising or branding with a permanent ink approved by the authority. Such brand will be in letters not less than 10 mm high and shall as a minimum embody the hazard rating and the registered number. Face brand has a corresponding meaning."
