

This draft Standard has been prepared to replace NZS 1188:1954 *Fire doors and fire windows* as the approved means of compliance with NZS 1900:Chapter 5 *Fire resisting construction and means of egress*.

It is also intended to be the agreed basis for the design, manufacture and installation of all fire doors and fire windows required by any regulation, code, or bylaw in New Zealand.

The draft Standard sets out the performance requirements for fire doors and fire windows rather than laying down detailed prescriptions for their construction and installation as in NZS 1188. It also includes requirements for the installation of fire doors and fire windows which will ensure compliance with the performance requirements, and act as a practical guide to designers and builders.

The draft ensures technical compatibility with Australian performance criteria, where such criteria are consistent with New Zealand manufacturing and installation practices.
