Radiation Protection Regulations 1982

Exemption of Sealed Radioactive Materials in Schools

Pursuant to regulation 8 (3) of the Radiation Protection Regulations 1982, I, Andrew Craig McEwan, Director, National Radiation Laboratory, Department of Health, hereby give the following notice:

Notice

The sealed radioactive materials prepared for purposes of instruction or demonstration specified in the Schedule to this notice are hereby exempt from sections 12 and 13 (1) of the Radiation Protection Act 1965, from 1 August 1988, subject to the following conditions:

(a) When not in use the radioactive source shall be kept in secure storage, which carries a label as described in clause 2 of the Second Schedule to the Radiation Protection Regulations 1982:

(b) When no longer required, the sources shall be sent to the National Radiation Laboratory for disposal.

Schedule

The nuclides sodium -22, Cobalt -60, Strontium -90, Caesium -137 and thallium -204, in activities not exceeding 1 megabecquerel in each source, and the nuclides polonium -210, radium -226, thorium -232, uranium -238, plutonium -239 and americium -241, in activities not exceeding 0.3 megabecquerel in each source.
