Pursuant to section 5A of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the joint recommendation of the Minister of Transport and the Minister of Conservation and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order:

- 1. This order may be cited as the Port Boundary Order 1988.
- ${f 2.}$ This order shall come into force on the 1st day of June 1988.
- **3. Definition of Boundaries**—The areas of seabed, foreshore and waters described in the Schedule to this order are hereby encompassed within Port Boundaries.
