An open season for game is declared in that area of the Firth of Thames hereinafter named the Firth of Thames Open Game Area and being that area that is enclosed between the boundary of the Auckland Acclimatisation District and a line connecting the points on that boundary by passing through Orere Point on the west side of the Firth and the southern headland of Fantail Bay on the Coromandel Peninsula, subject to the conditions specified hereto and in the First Schedule.

- 1. Game may only be hunted or killed in the Firth of Thames Open Game Area in compliance with conditions specified for the Auckland Acclimatisation District 1989 open season for
- 2. Any licence authorising the holder to hunt or kill game within the Auckland Acclimatisation District for the 1989 open season for game shall similarly authorise the holder to hunt or kill game in the Firth of Thames Open Game Area.
