hide or maimai, except within a distance of 10 metres from: the water margin in non-tidal waters, or from the low water mark in tidal waters, or from the outside edge of the raupo growth where raupo abounds.

- It shall be an offence for any person to leave on the hunting ground the bodies or parts of bodies of black swan or other game shot in the Otago Acclimatisation District.
- Shooting from a boat is prohibited on the Mataura River and Clutha River downstream of Clydevale during the month of May 1990 incl.
