Summary of Bills Introduced

Sport, Fitness, and Leisure Amendment

This Bill amends the Recreation and Sport Act 1987. The main changes are:

- (a) The concept of recreation is replaced by the concepts of fitness and physical leisure activity;
- (b) The name of the principal Act is changed from the Recreation and Sport Act 1987 to the Sport, Fitness, and Leisure Act 1987, and the name of the Hillary Commission is changed to the Hillary Commission for Sport, Fitness, and Leisure;
- (c) The membership of the Commission is reduced from 11 to 9, 8 of whom are to be appointed by the Minister. The remaining
