

Notice

1. This notice may be cited as the Te Kura Kaupapa Maori o Arowhenua.
2. This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.
3. I hereby establish at Regent Street, Invercargill, a primary school called Te Kura Kaupapa Maori o Arowhenua and I hereby designate the school as a Kura Kaupapa Maori.
4. Aims and objectives of Te Kura Kaupapa Maori o Arowhenua:

Together with the use of Te Reo Maori as the principal language of instruction the following aims, purposes and objectives constitute the character of Te Kura Kaupapa Maori o Arowhenua.

- (i) To provide an education that is an extension of Te Kohanga Reo beginnings.
 - (ii) To produce well-balanced, confident, highly motivated bilingual and bicultural pupils.
 - (iii) To strive for excellence in all areas, to value success, and to build on the self esteem of pupils.
 - (iv) To acknowledge Maori structures and processes in education.
 - (v) To promote an education that values all aspects of Maoritanga.
5. Constitution of the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees of Te Kura Kaupapa Maori o Arowhenua shall comprise:
 - (a) 5 people appointed by the Minister; and
 - (b) The principal or principal designate; and
 - (c) Not more than 4 persons co-opted by the Board.

Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975

Saint Bede's College, Christchurch (Attendance Dues) Notice 1991

Pursuant to section 36 of the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975, the Minister of Education, hereby gives notice approving the charging of attendance dues at Saint Bede's College, Christchurch.

Notice

1. This notice shall be cited as the Saint Bede's College, Christchurch (Attendance Dues) Notice 1991.
2. The proprietor of the above-named school may enter into an agreement with the parents or other persons accepting responsibility for the education of a child at the above-named school requiring them to pay attendance dues.
3. The attendance dues payable in respect of any pupil shall be \$345 (excluding G.S.T.) per annum.
4. Attendance dues received by the proprietor shall be used for the purpose of paying for such improvements to, or for such capital works associated with, the buildings and associated facilities of the above-mentioned integrated school as may be required or approved by the Minister of Education, pursuant to section 40 (2) of the Private Schools Conditional Integration Act 1975, or for meeting debts, mortgages, liens, or other charges associated with any of the land and buildings that constitute the integrated school.
